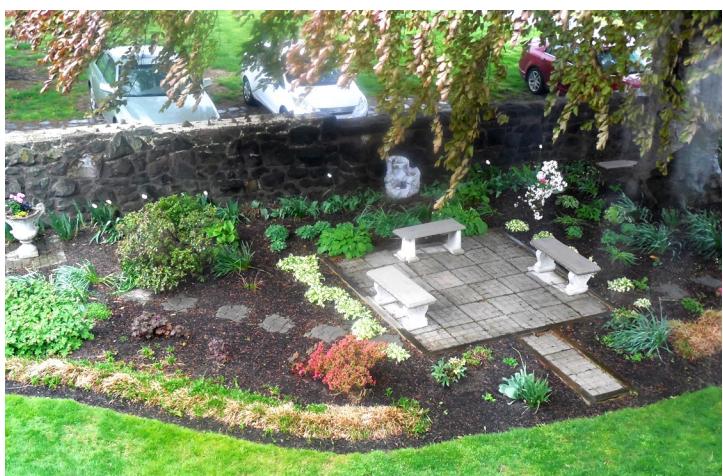

May 5 Program Installs New Officers and Welcomes Partner Susquehanna Art Museum

At the May 5 meeting, following a unanimous vote, President Schmedlen installed the new officers for 2014-2015 (see back page for new slate).

Following lunch, Gail Bishop introduced speakers Jack Scott and Dr. Laurene Buckley from the Susquehanna Art Museum.

Jack Scott is Chairman of the Board and has an extensive financial and technology background. He spoke on the financial status of the museum and the funding for the new museum being built on the corner of Calder and Third Street. He presented a slide show indicating the completed building and the various areas contained within the building. There will be meeting areas, an education center and a fenced outdoor area, which would lend itself to shows and seminars, a gift shop and food facilities.

Parking will be more available than at their present site, especially for school buses.

Dr. Laurene Buckley, Executive Director, came to the Susquehanna Art Museum with 25 years of museum experience. She spoke about the various programs planned. There will be no permanent art collection at the museum at this time. Exhibits will be on loan and therefore, there would be more variety for the public to enjoy.

Also, a permanent exhibit is expensive to maintain. The goal is to be accessible, interesting, educational and an enjoyable experience for the public.

A question and answer period followed. President-elect Gail Bishop thanked our speakers and presented them with small gifts and a \$100 donation to the museum.

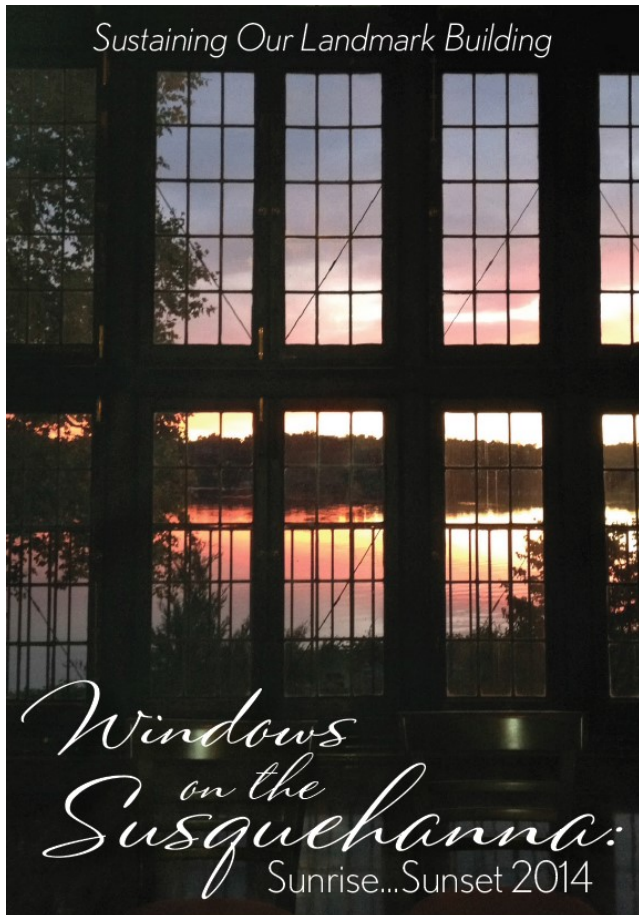

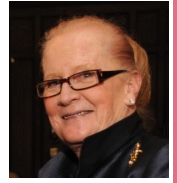
NEW MEMBER ORIENTATION
