When Delivering a Critical Message is Paramount, Count on the 193rd Special Operations Wing of the Pennsylvania Air National Guard



Motto: Never Seen, Always Heard

The 193rd Special Operations Wing (SOW) of the Pennsylvania Air National Guard, located at Harrisburg International Airport in Middletown, PA, is home to the only airborne Military Information Support Operations broadcasting platform in the U.S. military.

Military deployments and assignments often mean that families are separated and hardships endured. In honor of all our active and retired military personnel, our speakers for the November 3, 2014, luncheon program, Master Sergeants Martina Crouse and Jamie Everett, will share stories about the 193rd Special Operations Wing.

As a Pennsylvania Air National Guard unit, 193rd SOW Airmen and women wear two hats. In peacetime, the unit serves under the governor of Pennsylvania, bolstering missions such as support to civilian authorities during natural disasters or to enhance and assist homeland security. In wartime or in a contingency, (as designated by the Secretary of Defense as an operation in which members of the Armed Forces are or may become involved in military actions, operations, or hostilities against an enemy of the United States or against an opposing force) the 193rd SOW reports to Air Force Special Operations Command.

Flying the EC-130J Commando Solo, a specially-modified four-engine Hercules transport, the 193rd SOW conducts information operations, psychological operations and civil affairs broadcasts.

Master Sergeant Martina J. Crouse currently serves the Pennsylvania Air National Guard as the Recruiting Office Supervisor for the 193d Special Operations Wing. Her primary responsibility is to supervise, train and motivate recruiting staff to fill mission critical vacancies. Born in Mount Union, PA, she has distinguished herself in her work, professional military training and academic education. Crouse has a Bachelor’s Degree in Communications and MBA degree from Eastern University.

Master Sergeant Jamie H. Everett is assigned to the 193rd Special Operations Medical Group. She is responsible for the day-to-day Medical Operations and Training Management of the Chemical, Biological, Radiological, and Nuclear Task Force. Growing up in a military family, she has called many places home around the United States. MSgt Everett has participated in six deployments including Operation Iraqi Freedom, Operation New Dawn, Operation Enduring Freedom and one joint NATO mission. Master Sergeant Everett has one son, SrA Jacob A. Everett, who serves with the 201st Red Horse Squadron.

The program starts with a “meet and greet” reception November 3 at 11:30 a.m., followed by lunch and the presentation. Lunch is \$16.00. Rynn made cheese making look easy enough for each of us to try at home!

Tastealotta is located at 829 State Street in Lemoyne. It's a great place to purchase extra virgin, fused and infused olive oils from around the world; aged traditional and naturally-flavored balsamic vinegars from Modena, Italy; specialty salts and Himalayan Salt Block and other fine flavorings and gourmet accessories. And, one of the pleasant features of shopping at Tastealotta is that you get to sample and savor the oils and vinegars before you purchase them.

The perfect complement to Cathie's presentation was given by the charming Rynn Caputo, mother of the two sons for whom the Caputo Brothers Creamery is named. Using two pounds of curds, four large handfuls of kosher salt and a pot of hot water, Rynn turned the curds into incredibly delicious fresh mozzarella cheese before our eyes. Gently mixing, stretching and forming cheese balls in a matter of a few minutes, Rynn produced the most incredibly smooth, mouth-melting, buttery tastings and delicious cheese most everyone had ever sampled. Alone or drizzled with Tastealotta olive oil, the final tasting was
