TCCH invites you to “Harrisburg: Our Water’s Worth It!” Monday, October 5, 2015

TCCH’s own Jean Cutler, President of the Harrisburg Rain Barrel Coalition, will be joined at *Overlook* by Shannon Williams, P.E., Executive Director of Capital Region Water, and Geoffrey Knight, Chief Planner for the City of Harrisburg, to talk about how we can, collectively and individually, be a part of the clean water solution by presenting “Harrisburg: Our Water’s Worth It.”

As one of the privileged stewards of the beautiful Susquehanna River, the City of Harrisburg and Capital Region Water face challenges in the management of the city’s polluted storm water runoff and required upgrades to the city’s water treatment facility. Under a partial consent decree by EPA and DEP, Capital Region Water and Harrisburg must plan and implement programs that will meet compliance with the Clean Water Act within the next five years.

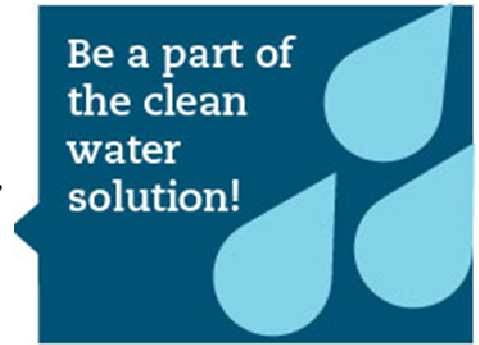
Over eighty percent of Harrisburg is served by a combined sewer system that collects and carries both rainwater and wastewater from homes and businesses in the same pipes. Under normal circumstance, this water is treated at the wastewater

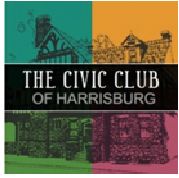
plant; however, during a severe wet weather event, the current system is designed to overflow at

one or more of sixty permitted outfalls along Paxton Creek and the Susquehanna River. In 2013, Harrisburg had 83 combined sewer overflows!

Join us for this timely and important conversation about the state of our water supply. The program starts with a Meet and Greet Reception at 11:30 a.m., followed by lunch at noon and the presentation. Gail Bishop, TCCH President, will also give a brief business report. ***And, thanks to a grant from the PA Department of Environmental Protection, individuals attending the program will have the opportunity to purchase a rain barrel for only \$25.00!***

Proceeds support the Pennsylvania Breast Cancer Coalition (PBCC) and TCCH's landmark building restoration fund. Chef Moeller is an engaging speaker who will share secrets to feeding three First Families and numerous heads of state as part of this charity tea & silent auction.

The cost is \$50 per person and the event will include traditional tea fare, remarks by Chef Moeller, and silent auction. Anchorwoman Alicia Richards of ABC27 will serve as the guest emcee, and State Representative Sue Helm and State Representative Patty Kim will serve as honorary Co-Chairwomen.

Moeller is a Lancaster native, the author of *Dining at the White House*, and the owner of an elite Lancaster-based catering business called "A State of Affairs." He joined the White House kitchen in 1992 and prepared personalized presidential dishes for 13 years. Chef Moeller will be signing his book *Dining at the White House: From the President's Table to Yours* after his presentation. The book costs \$35.00 plus tax and can be purchased at the Tea.

The Civic Club of Harrisburg and The Pennsylvania Breast Cancer Coalition have joined together for this special fundraising event. It is important that our daughters and granddaughters will not suffer from this disease, which currently strikes one in eight women. With this desire in mind, TCCH has opened their historic building *Overlook* in an effort to help raise money for ongoing breast cancer research.

TCCH's OWN JEWEL IN THE CROWN

Mira Lloyd Dock and Other Conservation Movers and Shakers Profiled by WITF

Pennsylvania has a long, significant, and stunning legacy of environmental activism, now justly being promoted through a statewide initiative, *Pennsylvania's Conservation Heritage: Telling the Story*. As part of that program, The State Museum of Pennsylvania on September 15 hosted a preview of two new short documentaries on Pennsylvania conservation legends produced and to be broadcast by WITF-TV in November. Several TCCH members attended. One of the videos highlighted the environmental achievements of The Civic Club of Harrisburg's co-founder, Mira Lloyd Dock, and prominently featured The Civic Club of Harrisburg. Here is a synopsis:

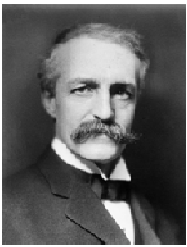


Mira Lloyd Dock: A Beautiful Crusade

In 1899 women were seen not heard. But not Mira Lloyd Dock, a little known Progressive Era activist. This botanist, forester and preservationist brought the City Beautiful movement to Pennsylvania's Capitol city. She helped transform it from a grimy disease-ridden mess to a cleanly manicured and modern state Capitol. During Dock's 12 years of service on the Pennsylvania Forest Commission, one million acres of forest became reserves. She was the first woman in the world to be appointed to a public forest commission. And, she was the first woman to hold a job in Pennsylvania government, either appointed or elected.

The second documentary is about former Pennsylvania Governor, Gifford Pinchot an environmental visionary and advocate.

Gifford Pinchot's Conservation Legacy



As America's first-trained forester and conservationist, Gifford Pinchot used his wealth, intellect, and power to protect the nation's natural resources for "the greatest good, for the greatest number, in the long run." In 1898, Pinchot was appointed as Chief of the Division of Forestry in the U.S. Department of Agriculture under President William McKinley. In 1905, he became head of the newly established United States Forest Service. Working with President Theodore Roosevelt, he played a significant role in shaping American conservation policy and expanding the nation's forest reserves. As Pennsylvania's only governor serving two non-consecutive terms, Pinchot helped pull farmers out of the mud with the establishment of some of the first paved rural roads in the commonwealth. During the great Depression

he put Pennsylvanians back to work regenerating clear cut forests and planting trees, providing the model for the national Civilian Conservation Corps program.

The Civic Club of Harrisburg has invited WITF, PA Department of Environmental Protection, PA Department of Conservation and Natural Resources and the PA Historical and Museum Commission to host a viewing of the documentaries at *Overlook*.

We're also planning a bus trip to *Grey Towers*, the Pike County estate of Governor Pinchot and his equally notable spouse, Cornelia. It is a delightful property with wonderful stories about the Pinchot family. Milford, PA, the town where Grey Towers is located, hosted the first Yale Forestry School, which was, of course, promulgated by Gifford Pinchot. Stay tuned for more news about these two exciting events!

The thirty minute documentaries were produced by WITF Public Media as part of the Pennsylvania Conservation Heritage Project and will premiere on WITF on Thursday, November 12, from 8:30 p.m. to 10:00 p.m. The third documentary will profile Ralph Abele of the Pennsylvania Fish Commission.
