Sloan and Christ will address Harrisburg Mayor Papenfuse's administration's vision on the arts, culture, tourism and housing on the local economy and the initiatives being developed to enhance the livability and vitality of the City of Harrisburg.

"We are fortunate to have such accomplished speakers for our opening program," said Gail Bishop, president of the Civic Club. "We appreciate their willingness to take time from their busy schedules to speak to us about their vision for the City of Harrisburg."

For the past 40 years, Sloan has provided inspiration, leadership and technical assistance both in the public and private sectors and often refers to himself as a "catalytic agent, animator and facilitator of cultural and heritage programs." Career highlights from his work in Pennsylvania includes Commonwealth services as past Film Commissioner and Director of Pennsylvania's Cultural and Heritage Tourism Program. His portfolio includes the Pennsylvania Festival Initiative, the Appalachian Regional Commission's 13 state Geo-Tourism Initiative, the award- winning Artisans' Craft Trails, the PA Civil War Trails and collaboration with the National Park Services' 50-site Underground Railroad Trail.

He has served on various artistic teams which created award-winning documentaries and plays as well as providing leadership to various federal and state arts, humanities and tourism programs.

Christ has a strong interest in education, politics and community activism and worked for over 10 years in the construction industry. His career highlights include employment as an industrial arts teacher in both Schuylkill and Dauphin Counties, service as vice-president of the Capital Region Intermediate Unit, and director on the Harrisburg School Board where he served as president on two separate occasions. Currently, Christ is president of the Midtown Action Council, and member of the Pennsylvania State Education Association and International Association of Ironworkers.
